As an Anglican priest in the East End of London, Angus will argue that community organising offers a route to inclusive populism, that sees strangers become fellow citizens who build stronger and more inclusive communities together.

Angus will share with us his experience and reflections. There will also be time for relationship building and an opportunity to think together about how to put this into practice through the work of our own organisations and the alliance of Tyne & Wear Citizens.
